RE: Support for FirstNet Reauthorization

Dear Senator Curtis:

The Utah Chiefs of Police Association strongly supports the reauthorization of FirstNet consistent with the original statutory framework established by Congress in the Middle-Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act of 2012. We do not support changes to the governance or management oversight structure created in that legislation.

For police chiefs, fire chiefs, and public safety executives here in Utah and nationwide, FirstNet is not an abstract policy concept. It is a daily operational system that supports incident command, responder safety, coordinated response, and disaster operations. Its success is directly attributable to Congress's decision to vest governance authority in an independent entity with strong public safety representation.

That structure reflects a deliberate legislative determination that public safety practitioners are best positioned to guide the development, investment, and operational priorities of a nationwide public safety broadband network. Modifying this framework risks weakening public safety's voice and undermine the stability that mission critical communications require.

Existing law already provides appropriate accountability and transparency, including independent annual audits conducted by the Department of Commerce. When audit findings are identified and communicated, corrective actions are implemented that strengthen and improve the program. This balanced oversight model distinguishes FirstNet and helps ensure its continued success.
